White Rock Official Community Plan

White Rock City is reviewing and updating the Official Community Plan. Part of this process is a community survey build toward a vision for the City's future. Please take 10 minutes to complete the survey – link here www.whiterockcity.ca/imaginewhiterock. Response will be anonymous (not individually reported). On February 16th PH2H appeared before Council to speak on the Affordable Housing Strategy and by unanimous decision of Council was told it would be included in the OCP update process.

ACTION TO TAKE: When you get to 'Other' in Question #18 please mention housing, and tools that City Council can create and use to get affordable housing built: land banking, inclusionary zoning (when re-zoning approvals require inclusion of affordable housing units), rental conversion by-law, standards of maintenance by-laws, establishing an Affordable Housing Fund, etc.

Future of Regional Homeless Counts

In future the federal government wants to have local communities across Canada do homeless counts at

the same time in January. This is what happens in the USA currently for their federal funding dollars (and nowhere else). We've heard that Metro Vancouver Community Entity (where local federal funding is managed) has been informed that the CE must do at least 1 point in time homeless count during the current 5 year contract (2014 – 2019). This will probably be the 2017 regional homeless count. It's unclear whether the required count will be fully federally funded or not.

Isobel Mackenzie BC Seniors Advocate Housing Report

This report highlights significant research into the affordability, appropriateness and availability of housing for seniors across the continuum from independent housing, to assisted living, to residential care. Homeless Partnering Strategy

Sources Community Resources Society (SOURCES) tenancy and income support advocacy program, Essentials to Housing Support Services, has had its funding renewed through the federal Homelessness Partnering Strategy (HPS). Earlier this year, when it looked like funding would not be renewed, hundreds of local resident raised money through the Coldest Night of the Year to support homeless prevention services at SOURCESBC.
